- Conduct an inventory count
- Identify the high-use, high-volume, and one-of-a-kind custom items
- Remove excess stock
- Invest in new storage equipment
- Develop a process for inventory control

Just like at home, clear plastic drawers and bins offer a huge storage advantage by allowing easy viewing of contents while eliminating additional touchpoints and reducing time spent searching for an item.

Stainless steel shelving racks are among the most common types of wire shelving units used today. Their benefits include durability and natural resistance to rust and corrosion, which is especially valuable in a humid environment or for wet objects. The primary advantage that stainless steel shelving offers is its weight capacity.

The Magic of Vertical Space

Specifically, when you have vertical space available, here are some things you should know:

- Vertical shelving utilizes available room height from floor to ceiling
- It may eliminate the need to search storage carts placed throughout the department
- Items can be picked quickly and accurately with shelving automation

Enclosing both sterile and unsterile instruments in cabinets is a growing preference in sterile processing departments.

Taming storage challenges may save time, avoid mad scrambles in search of needed items, and help with management since you can't manage something you can't even see. In the end, a better storage system may provide a cost-effective plan for improved patient safety.
